On Monday, at the Curriculum Day, our teachers worked with Penny Jayne, the managing director of <u>Global Education Equity Alliance</u>. Michelle, Kira, and myself, worked with Penny earlier in the year when we attended the Harvard DATAWISE course in January. Penny went through the instructional core of learning- the *student*, the *teacher* and the *content*- and how they relate to each other. She also spoke to us about equity, and shining an equity lens on everything we do at WG. It was very reaffirming, as I think we offer a very inclusive environment, so our equity lens is already in focus. However, there is always room for improvement!

In the afternoon we worked through more of our Visible Wellbeing program, and started the "E" component, "E" representing Emotional Management. When this component is covered in the classroom the teachers will focus on gratitude, and things we can be grateful for at Wattle Glen primary. Then we will have a display of paper flowers to make a gratitude garden. I am looking forward to seeing it complete.

Speaking of things I am looking forward to, the grade one late stay and the grade two/three sleepover is on Thursday. These activities are the foundation steps for our camping program. I can't wait to eat dinner with everyone and watch a movie, before going to sleep and waking up for a delicious breakfast. 

CHILD SAFETY STANDARDS

The new Child Safe Standards came into force in Victoria on 1 July 2022. The 11 Child Safe Standards are listed below.

Standard 1

Organisations establish a culturally safe environment in which the diverse and unique identities

Standard 2

Child safety and wellbeing is embedded in organisational leadership, governance and culture.

Standard 3

Children and young people are empowered about their rights, participate in decisions affecting them and are taken seriously.

Standard 4

Families and communities are informed and involved in promoting child safety and wellbeing.

Standard 5

Equity is upheld and diverse needs respected in policy and practice.

Standard 6

People working with children and young people are suitable and supported to reflect child safety and wellbeing values in practice.

Standard 7

Processes for complaints and concerns are child-focused.

Standard 8

Staff and volunteers are equipped with the knowledge, skills and awareness to keep children and young people safe through ongoing education and training.

Standard 9

Physical and online environments promote safety and wellbeing while minimising the opportunity for children and young people to be harmed.

Standard 10

Implementation of the Child Safe Standards is regularly reviewed and improved.

Standard 11

Policies and procedures document how the organisation is safe for children and young people.


